The Intersection of English Language Acquisition and Individualized Education Programs January-June 2025

The Test Setup Window for ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS has now begun and will last throughout your ACCESS test window.

The test setup function in <u>WIDA AMS</u> lets you view students and modify registrations. As you prepare for the upcoming ACCESS administration, **you should now login to** <u>WIDA AMS</u> **and make sure your students are entered in the appropriate registrations.**

Students that were imported into <u>WIDA AMS</u> via the Student Import File (Pre-ID file) have been automatically placed into generic registrations based on grade cluster and domain.

View Registrations To view and filter registrations in <u>WIDA AMS</u>, click the **Manage Registrations** tile on the landing page. Then, filter by the district and/or school from the site selector on the top right side of the





screen. Select the **ACCESS for ELLs - 2024-2025** Registration Window and a list of registrations for those sites will display on the View Registration(s) tab.
